



## Interventional cosmetics: Recent advances in facial procedures

### Background:

Interventional cosmetics is the most rapidly growing branch of medicine and dentistry today, and has fired the public's imagination. Improvements in treatment methods and treatment devices are continually extending the ability of doctors and dentists to provide aesthetic enhancement, not only for patients with illness but also for healthy people, whether old or young.

### Educational aims & objectives:

The symposium aims to provide an update in the latest trends and techniques in interventional cosmetics with respect to the face.

Following this symposium the delegate will be conversant with recent advances in knowledge and skills in this area.

### Dr Pierre Andre

Author of more than 60 academic papers, Dr Pierre Andre also sits on the editorial board of the Journal of Cosmetic Dermatology. He is a member of various international organisations including the Société Française de Dermatologie, American Academy of Dermatology and the European Society for Laser in Dermatology (ESLD). A founding member and Past President of the European Society for Aesthetic & Cosmetic Dermatology (ESCAD), he is also the Scientific Director of the Anti-Ageing World Congress (AAWC). Dr Andre works in private practice.



### Dr Ashraf Badawi

Dr Badawi is a lecturer in Dermatology at the National Institute of Laser Enhanced Sciences at Cairo University and is a visiting lecturer at Szeged University in Hungary. He is Secretary General of the Afro Asian Society for Cosmetic Dermatology and Laser (ASCDDL). He is a member of the European Society of Cosmetic and Aesthetic Dermatology (ESCAD) and of other institutions worldwide including the American Academy of Dermatology (AAD).



### Dr Koenraad De Boule

Dr Koenraad De Boule is a Dermatologist and the director of the private Aalst Dermatology Clinic in Aalst in Belgium. Dr De Boule is a frequent lecturer and speaker at national and international conferences and scientific meetings and author or co-author of more than 30 peer-reviewed scientific publications. He holds advisory positions for different major therapeutic and cosmetic companies and is an advisor and expert on medical devices to the French Ministry of Public Health since 2007.

## Speaker profiles



### Dr Desmond Fernandes

Dr Desmond Fernandes graduated from Witwatersrand University in Johannesburg and obtained F.R.C.S. (Edin) in 1973. He worked at various hospitals in the UK and in 1973 joined Professor Christiaan Barnard in the world famous heart transplant unit at Groote Schuur Hospital, Cape Town. In 1975, he returned to Plastic Surgery and eventually became the consultant in charge of Cleft Lip and Palate Division at the Red Cross Children's Hospital which he retired from in 2000 after 21 years. Dr Fernandes has lectured at many plastic and reconstructive surgery and dermatology conferences worldwide and has written numerous papers and chapters for medical publications on various plastic surgery procedures.



### Dr Elaine Halley

Dr Elaine Halley is the principal of Cherrybank Dental Spa, a private practice in Perth. Her main interest is in cosmetic and advanced restorative dentistry and she has studied extensively in the United States and the UK. She is the President of the British Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry – a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to promoting excellence in cosmetic dentistry through education and certification. Dr Halley serves on the editorial board for Private Dentistry and Aesthetic Dentistry Today, and is a member of the judging panel for the Private Practice of the Year Awards sponsored by FMC.



### Mr Paul Harris

Paul Harris has been a Consultant Plastic Surgeon at The Royal Marsden Hospital in London since 2004. He practices privately in both Aesthetic and Reconstructive Surgery in Central London, Surrey and The Channel Islands. His particular interest lies in Applied Anatomy related to aesthetic procedures, having undertaken a Royal College of Surgeons (RCS) sponsored Aesthetic Surgery Fellowship in Melbourne, Australia. He has written over 50 papers and book chapters, and continues to give regular invited lectures and scientific presentations in many aspects of plastic surgery.



### Mr Niall Kirkpatrick

Niall Kirkpatrick is a Consultant Craniofacial Plastic Surgeon. He qualified in both Dentistry (BDS) in 1984 and Medicine (MBBS) in 1990 from Guy's Hospital, University of London. After completing training in General Surgery and becoming a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (FRCS) in 1996, he trained in Plastic Surgery and was accredited by the Royal College of Surgeons (FRCS Plast) in 2001. He has also completed a postgraduate doctoral thesis and was awarded the degree of Doctor of Medicine (MD) in 1996 from the University of London. He is head of the Craniofacial Unit at Chelsea and Westminster Hospital, London, and a member of the Multidisciplinary Head and Neck Cancer Unit at The Royal Marsden Hospital and previously at Charing Cross Hospital, London. He is a past President of the Royal Society of Medicine Plastic Surgery section.



### Mr Ian Mackay

Ian Mackay is Honorary Consultant ENT Surgeon to King Edward VII and the Lister Hospital, London. He is past President of the Section of Laryngology & Rhinology at the Royal Society of Medicine and Past President of ENT-UK (British Association of Otorhinolaryngologists, Head and Neck Surgeons). He ran the Rhinoplasty Course with Mr Tony Bull at the Royal National Throat Nose and Ear Hospital for more than 20 years and has given lectures on Rhinoplasty as a Visiting Professor at the Mayo Clinic, Rochester, USA. He is a founder member of the European Academy of Facial Plastic Surgery (EAFPS).



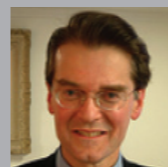
### Dr Barry Monk

Dr Monk qualified in Medicine at Jesus College, Cambridge (college exhibitor and prize-winner) and Westminster Medical School. He has been a Consultant Dermatologist at Bedford Hospital since 1987, and whilst at Bedford has established its renowned Laser Treatment Centre. He is a member of the British Association of Dermatologists and a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians. He was President of the Section of Dermatology of the Royal Society of Medicine 2008-2009. Dr Monk is a visiting professor at Cranfield University, and has been an examiner for the MRCP examination.



### Dr Christopher Orr

Dr Christopher Orr is one of the UK's most prominent cosmetic dentists, who practices Cosmetic and Restorative Dentistry in a multidisciplinary clinic in central London. He is an Accredited Member of the British Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry and also a Certified Member of the European Society of Cosmetic Dentistry. He is also a founder and Past President of the British Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry as well as being a Past President of the Odontology Section of the Royal Society of Medicine and a former Director of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry.



### Dr Christopher Rowland Payne

Christopher Rowland Payne is a Consultant Dermatologist at The London Clinic. He is also Secretary-General (and Past-President) of the European Society for Cosmetic & Aesthetic Dermatology (ESCAD). He qualified at St Bartholomew's Hospital, London and did House jobs at Barts, the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh and the Royal Marsden Hospital. He completed his post graduate dermatology training at St Thomas's Hospital and Westminster Hospital and was Professeur Universitaire in Paris 1984/5. He was founding editor of the Journal of Cosmetic Dermatology and his publications include "The atopic epidemic: why are atopic diseases more and more common? Diminished humidity may be the answer".
